2002 Rocky Mountain Mustang Roundup Overview

Golf Tournament - Thursday, June 13th

The 18-hole golf tournament will begin at 12:00 p.m. Fees are \$95.00 per person with cart. Fees will be collected at the Sheraton Steamboat Golf Club on the day of the event. Autocross - Friday, June 14th

The autocross will be held at the Tennis Meadows parking lot. There will be two sessions of the autocross (morning and afternoon). There is a limit of 130 drivers for the autocross. Each driver will complete three (3) runs. Autocross trophies will be awarded on Saturday at the Show. SCCA safety regulations will be enforced. Helmets will be required on the track (some loaner helmets will be available). **Pre-registration is required**
Cost of registration is \$20 per driver. Each car participating in the autocross is required to pay the registration fee. Maximum two drivers per registered car for participation in the autocross and each driver can only compete in one (1) car. Each driver participating in the autocross needs to complete the autocross question-

naire and mail the information along with the registration form. **AUTOCROSS PARTICIPANTS MUST PICK UP THEIR REGISTRATION PACKET AND GO THROUGH TECH BEFORE PARTICIPATING IN THE AUTOCROSS.**
