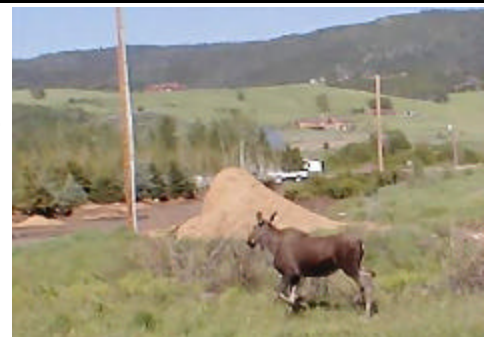
screeching in the auto-cross event! The auto-cross is SO much fun (if you can stomach the zigging and zagging). It ROCKS!
