SPONSOR'S REPORT

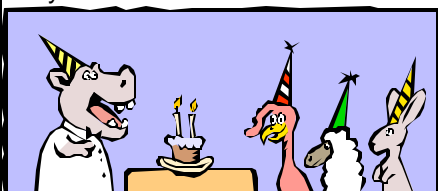
